Issue	Action log
Not enough Speed Gun Devices / outdated or regularly require calibration	Audit being carried out by HQ CSW team on use of cameras to ascertain if teams could be realigned. Review of teams and demising those that are not operational. JD working with OPCC re other PCC offices across UK.
45 minute time limit for CSW sessions	New process for dealing with errors in place, targeting regulars to provide support. CSW TLs to specify their own length of sessions.
CSW Teams do not feel like they are receiving enough return of information	New process in place to advise TEO of w3w of CSW locations advised to CPT. TEO results shared by email to JD / cascaded to TLs. Next TL meeting focus on TEO and Newsletter to all volunteers will include information.
We do not currently utilise ASW data, only the heat maps it provides.	ASW now accepted via report crime tool. Longer term, more investment required / business case being prepared.
Change to return form every two weeks is causing frustration and increase in administration time for volunteers.	JD working with PCC / WP on business case to demise use of excel s/sheet and move all returns to web browser.
CSW TLs have been told they cannot have a Deputy set up on DutySheet. This has caused volunteers to work when they are on holiday	JD offered this option on two occasions to TLs. Will raise at TL meeting 30th May 2022 and then propose closing action.
Effective training for CSW volunteers and Team Leaders. Current training is out of date and uses a two-stage process.	Thank you Dee Nix who has created an updated TL training doc. JD working with WP to approve and then use CSW ACs to assess training needs analysis of CSW TLs.
CPT data / allocation of Police to CSW sites is not transparent or understood by CSW TLs	CSW ACs explaining at meetings with CSW TLs. Use volunteer week to strengthen CSW TL / AC interactions with CPTs.
New sites are taking too long to be approved.	Additional resources confirmed for site approval process.

Meeting with Supt. Phil Staynings of Wiltshire Police on 27.04.2022

- The concept of using data from Speed Indicator Devices across Wiltshire to help inform Wiltshire Police where they need to focus Road Safety/Speed checks was presented at the meeting.
- 90 devices have been installed by 64 towns or parishes across Wiltshire
 - 80 are radar enabled and can detect vehicle speeds and display them
 - 10 have cameras which provide Vehicle Registration Number (VRN) capture
- There are 15 different makes of device of which only 1 make does not provide data export capability
- ABT has collected report samples for 8 of the 14 types of SID. As of 27.04, 81 ASW + SID sites can provide data/reports
- A pilot will be run in the Salisbury Community Police Team (CPT) area over the next 3 months. Data from 12 parishes will be collated and critical locations will be reviewed by the Adrian, the CSW Area Coordinator and CPT Police Officers. SID data will be used together with CSW Heat Maps and any Traffic Survey reports to determine which are the worst areas in need of attention and in what priority.
- Supt Staynings advised that Wiltshire Police are recruiting 3 Road Safety Officers who will be assigned to Swindon, central and south Wiltshire. Their role will be to liaise with communities on Road Safety issues. One of the RSO's will be assigned to work specifically on this SID data pilot to agree minimum data requirements and how best to share information with Wiltshire Police.
