2021 shows a marginal position on both accounts. That position will deteriorate in 2022 as the church quota is increased and not less than £5,000 of recommendations from the quinquennial inspection are factored into expenditure.

The Fabric account currently benefits from no major expenditure plans. The quinquennial inspection highlighted the need to repair stonework, replace the ladder to the tower, treat woodworm on the floor and repaint professionally a number of areas. No income has yet been received from the Furness Trust legacy which represents the bulk of income for Fabric.

The General account remains reliant on standing orders from villlagers which act as the bulwark for continuing solvency in the absence of collections. However there is little or no margin for comfort for unexpected contingency hence the reliance on generosity from funds raised at village events. The Diocesan share of £7,085 will be paid in full. Owing to shortfalls in the Diocesan budget that share will be increased materially over the next five years and possibly by as much as 10% for 2022.

Assuming a normal end of year pattern, 2021 should produce a breakeven result. The areas of risk remain the vagaries of the Diocesan budget plus a material item of Fabric expenditure which will happen at some stage given a 900 year old Grade 1 church building.
